

Placing Two Handles on a Single Drawer

QUESTION


I need to have two handles on my cabinet drawer instead of one, but I don't see a setting for this. Is this possible?

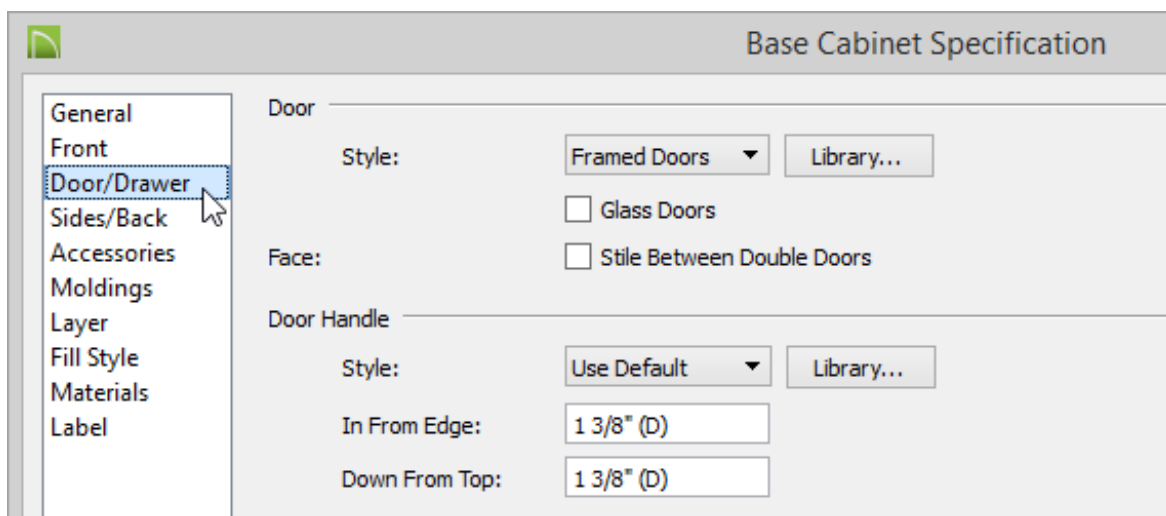


ANSWER

This can be done by opening the cabinet in question and selecting "Two Handles In From Edge" under Drawer Handle on the Door/Drawer panel.

To set two handles/knobs on a single drawer

1. Left click once on the cabinet and click the **Open Object**  edit button. For this example, a 36" wide base cabinet is used.
2. Click on the **DOOR/DRAWER** panel located on the left side of the specification dialog.



3. Under the **Drawer Handle** category:

Style: Framed Doors Library...

Face: Stile Between Double Doors

In From Edge: 1 3/8" (D)

Down From Top: 1 3/8" (D)

Door Hinges

Style: Use Default Library...

Up/Down From Edge: 3" (D)

Drawer

Style: Slab Drawers Library...


Drawer Handle

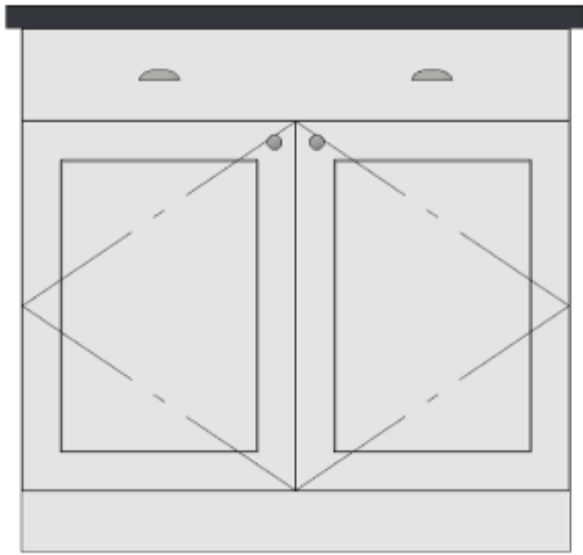
Style: Cup Pull Library...

Horizontal Position: Use Default

One Handle Centered

Two Handles In From Edge: 9"

- Specify the **Style** of handle/knob by clicking on the **Library** button. For this example, the "Cup Pull" drawer handle is used.
 - In the **Two Handles In From Edge** value box, enter the value the handles will be in from the edge of the drawer. For this example, a value of 9" is used.
4. Press the **Tab** key on your keyboard to see the changes reflected in the preview image.
5. Click **OK** and take an elevation view  to see the results.
